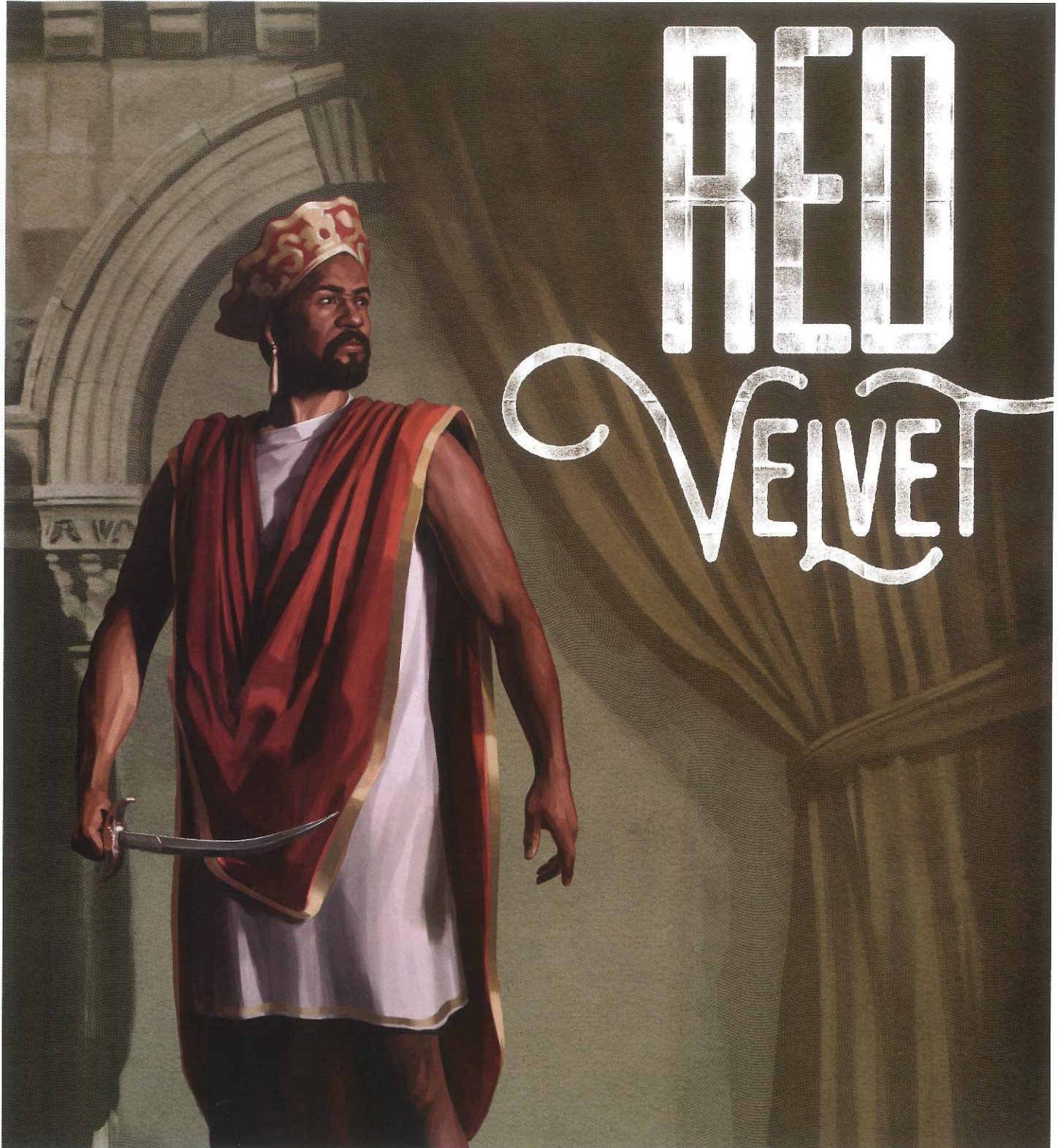

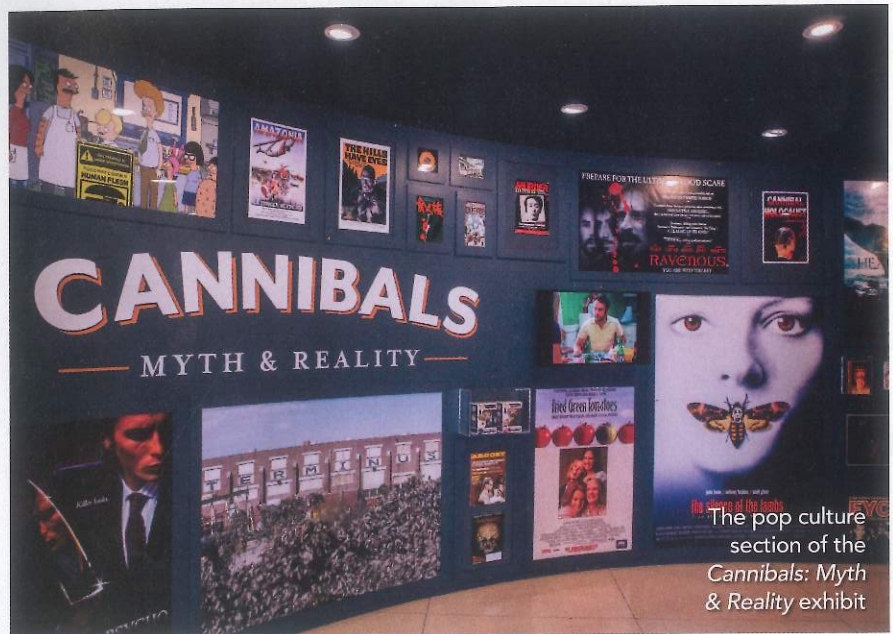

Springtime is prime time to visit the **San Diego Museum of Man**, located in the heart of Balboa Park. If you haven't explored its 150-foot-tall California Tower, now is your chance. Reopened after an 80-year closure, the public can once again climb its winding staircase inside to the top. The reward: some of the most spectacular views of the park, zoo, downtown, mountains and ocean. Tours are 40 minutes; tickets range from \$10-22.50 and can be purchased online in advance. Inside the museum, check out the special exhibit *Cannibals: Myth & Reality*, on view through 2018; and *Living*



with Animals, a brand-new exhibit that opened in March that examines man's relationship with all different kinds of animal life. An example: Visitors
